
## Shoreline management plan





- In England and Wales, a shoreline management plan (SMP) sets policies for managing flood and erosion risks.
- The Poole and Christchurch Bays SMP covers the 190km (118 miles) of open coast, harbours, estuaries and headlands between Durlston Head in the west and Hurst Spit to the east.
- Launched in 1999, the SMP was updated in 2010 (SMP2). This considers policies for 20, 50 and 100 years.

There are four SMP policy options:



- Managed realignment manage coastal processes to allow the coast to naturally realign.
- 3. Advance the line construct sea defences seaward to increase protection.
- 4. No active intervention do nothing (see below).




 It will outline the strategies for delivering the SMP(2) policies for Milford on Sea:
